Dear Licensee:

Your organization has been identified as being located in a county that has been declared a disaster area as a result of Hurricane Dolly. I and the employees of the Charitable Bingo Operations Division want you to know that we are here to assist you in dealing with recovery challenges related to your organization's charitable bingo activities.

In an effort to lessen the burden on your organization, you may request a 90-day extension for filing your bingo quarterly report and paying prize fees and/or rental taxes for the quarter ending June 30, 2008 (20082). If you request an extension, the quarterly report must be filed and prize fees and/or rental taxes paid on or before October 23, 2008. Any prize fees and/or rental taxes paid after this date will be assessed a 20% penalty and interest will begin to accrue at the rate of 8.25 percent per annum. You must submit the attached "Request for Extension for Submitting Second Quarter 2008 Texas Bingo Quarterly Reports" by August 1, 2008 for the extension to be granted.

If your organization was issued a temporary license that could not or cannot be conducted due to the hurricane, you can return the license(s) and request a change of playing day(s) and time(s). Additionally, if you need to amend the days or times of your bingo occasion due to this event, or if you would like to apply for a temporary license, you may fax an application to our office at 512-344-5142 and we will work closely with you to process these applications.

All annual license renewal applications must be submitted timely. Annual renewal applications must be filed with the Commission no later than the license expiration date. Annual renewal applications that are mailed must be postmarked on or before the license expiration date. A licensee that has not submitted a renewal application timely must cease all bingo activity until properly licensed.


If your organization's records are damaged or destroyed, many documents can be recreated from bank statements. Your bank should be able to provide you with copies of lost or destroyed bank statements. If you have cardminders, cardminder records can be provided by requesting sales information from the distributor.
