If the workgroup comes back and says that they're good with the language, as 13 Kim has just said, where -- how does it get into effect, 14 15 I guess, is what I'm trying to ask? 16 MR. VANCE: So, once you guys are okay 17 with it, then you can direct us to propose it. I'm not 18 sure how the Governmental Affairs folks want to handle --19 (Simultaneous discussion) 2.0 MR. BIARD: Yeah, I can jump in. Hi, this 21 is Bob Biard. 22 Yeah, this is something that, when we 23 outreach to other governmental entities- and the 24 25 Kickapoo Tribe is another entity. It's a -- its own

She has a great relationship with, I know, the people who represent them 3 at the Capitol, and this is how we've handled our 4 dealings with the Kickapoos in the past. 5 So, we would prefer, of course, to have 6 their agreement on any language before we propose it so 7 we just don't end up back in the same place we are right 8 So, I think once the BAC has language that they 9 10 are comfortable with and that we're comfortable with, I think Governmental Affairs would reach out to the 11 Kickapoos' representatives and see if we're all in 12 agreement. And, then, we would bring it to the 13 It would have to be 14 Commissioners as a rule proposal. 15 published and then put out for a 30-day comment period. 16 Then, it would be brought back to the following Commission meeting to be adopted. 17 Thanks. 18 MS. MR. HANSON: For the record, Tom Hanson,
Director of the Charitable Bingo Operations Division. I
wanted to share some information with you. Part of it
is old business, and part of it is an advisory.

First, regarding the reported unlawful activity being conducted on the Facebook and Instagram platforms, the agency has been in direct contact with Facebook officials and have put in a place a method of reporting that so far has been very beneficial. We have seen pages reviewed and, in most cases, shut down within hours of reporting. The Facebook officials shared with us their recommended method for the public to report a post that may violate the Facebook community standards against pages, groups, or events that facilitate or promote online gambling.

To report the post, click in the top right of the post and click on the three dots that appear; click "Find support" or "Report Post." And, then, to give feedback click the option that best describes how the post goes against the Facebook community standards, and then click "Next." When something gets reported to Facebook, they will review it and remove anything that does not follow their community standards. And I will share a document that has that -- those instructions on

it.

2 Secondly, I wanted to share the results of some research which reflects the impact of COVID-19 on 3 the bingo industry. Using the quarterly report data for 4 Quarters 1, 2, and 3 of 2020 and comparing that data 5 against the average of the same quarters for 2018 and 6 2019, we found the following: The number of occasions 7 held were down 15 percent for Quarter 1 and 3 but 8 60 percent down for Ouarter 2. The gross receipts 9 10 dropped 11 percent for Quarter 1, 54 percent for Quarter 2, but there was no significant drop for Quarter 3. 11 The total prices reported as paid was down 10 percent for 12 Quarter 1, 53 percent for Quarter 2 and, again, no 13 significant drop for Quarter 3. But by far the most 14 important charitable distributions showed a 20 percent 15 16 drop for Quarter 1, a 68 percent drop for Quarter 2, and a 37 percent drop for Quarter 3. 17

Now, the reports for Quarter 4 are not due until early next week, and I couldn't put those in this research. But I thought I would share with the BAC that information.

ROGERS: Absolutely. 16 Members, I would -- my first suggestion would be get that out to all of your charities and 17 18 everyone else in the bingo world that you have connections with because the more of us that tackle 19 that, of course, the better, and thank you. 2.0 Tom, if you can share those numbers, the 21 percentages with me, I would appreciate it. 22 I would include it with my summary for the Commissioners. 23 I will do that. 24 MR. HANSON: 25 MS. ROGERS: Thank you.

HANSON: 23 didn't get back to you on that. We had a little bit of 24 a concern because there was not enough specifics in it 25 for us to apply rule.



9	it was bingo. And, so, I think that's why you didn't
10	get a direct answer on the first pass. But, in general,
11	I'll say that the Bingo Act doesn't limit the use of
12	bingo funds to Texas incorporated entities or insurance
13	companies.
