Tyler, I'm assuming you're the one that's fixed that or at least had somebody fix it. My understanding is that is up and working and working very efficiently, so I've been told. If that is the case, we definitely want to say thank you and congratulations for getting that done.

MR. VANCE: Sure. Yeah, thanks, y'all. They are up and running. You can find the forms on the website, and they're also available on BSP. I think we've received a few already coming -- trickling in. I sent you guys an e-mail a couple of weeks ago when it went live and encouraged you to pass the word around or ask us any questions.

And I just want to make sure that everyone is aware that when you submit the Form 17, you're issued the licenses, and they're blank. They have no date or time. And before you can use them, you have to notify us by submitting the Form 18, and that has to be before the occasion. Now, the difference is, in the past, you used to have to wait for us to then approve that, and

1 | now you don't.

So, now, you need to submit it at any
point before the occasion. You can e-mail it. You can
fax it. You can snail mail it, as long as it's
postmarked the day before, but it just needs to be sent
to us before the occasion starts.

If the Form 18 is sent in after the occasion, then that occasion is unlicensed just because you're issued a license when you submit Form 17, that license can't be used until we receive Form 18 letting us know the specific date and time that it's used. So, if you send in that Form 18 after the occasion, you're just telling us that you just conducted an unlicensed occasion, which is going to have to become an enforcement issue, and that's why I kind of -- I threw out the warning in my e-mail to y'all.

This is a great privilege. It provides you guys with a lot of flexibility. You can conduct a session on the fly on a Friday or Saturday night if you're super busy. But it comes with more responsibilities, and it comes with more risks than a traditional temporary license, which has the date and time specified way in advance.

You know, we know. We have a record of it. You have a record of it. Everyone knows when the

occasion is scheduled, and there's never going to be an issue of an unlicensed occasion or a missing record on an old-fashioned temporary.

But when you use a temporary on demand, you have to be very careful and very diligent about making sure that you submit it and submit it correctly before the occasion and then also maintaining records of it in case you get audited and then the auditor sees some occasion that's outside of your normal hours. They're going to want proof that you did, in fact, submit that form before the occasion. So, again, it gives you guys some flexibility, and I'm glad we got it up and running. I know you guys have wanted it for a long time, but just be careful with it. That's all I ask.

MR. SMITH: Great, man. We certainly appreciate that. We know that it's been a long time in the works, and there's been some hiccups on it. We just appreciate the attention to detail from you and the staff. I know that was a big undertaking. We're definitely grateful. I know a lot of people are going to be able to utilize that and make some more monies for the charities. So, that's awesome.

All right. Is there any other old

talking about the Commission facilities and the hearing 1 room is going to be configured a little differently 2. 3 because of all the health and safety protocols, I think I'd caution -- I'd prefer not to make a final decision 4 right now. But let us talk a little bit with the 5 Administration staff, and let them know that's what 6 we're thinking about doing and then get back with you. 7 MS. FIELDS: Okay. That's what we'll do. 8 Thank, Bob. 9 MR. SMITH: Yeah, that sounds great. 10 I do appreciate that. I know we do miss Thank you. 11 seeing everyone and hearing how everyone is doing, not 12 only in a work aspect, but in a personal aspect, as 13 well. MR. MARTIN: No. You know, we were wanting to go with plastic, and one of the Indian tribes had some question or objected to that. And they were going to rewrite the rules, and I think it was going to go in front of the Commission. Can someone tell me what happened with that?

MR. SMITH: Tyler, I'm going to refer to you on that. I'm not -- I wasn't 100 percent versed on that. I don't want to speak out of line on that.

MR. VANCE: Sure. So, at the last BAC meeting you guys approved of kind of the draft proposed language, and then we agreed that before we formally proposed it as a rule, Governmental Affairs was going to reach out to the Kickapoo's lawyer or lobbyist and kind of run it by them first before we propose it so that way we don't formally propose it and then they don't like it again and then we have to go back and revise it again. And I'm not sure of the status on that. I know with session going on I think -- I mean, I'll let Nelda speak on this, but I think she was probably going to wait until session was over to reach out to the Kickapoos on

that. 2 MR. MARTIN: Okay. That answered my 3 question. Thank you. All right. Yes, sir. 4 MR. SMITH: If there's no other old business, I'm 5 going to consider this new business now. Is there any 6 new business that anybody would like to bring up or talk 7 about? 8 MR. VANCE: Yeah. Trace, this is Tyler. 9 We've noticed an issue recently. When you guys transfer 10 money into your bingo account from an outside source, 11 you're required to submit Form No. 14, which is a 12 transfer of funds form. 13 Now, at the top of that form you'll see it 14 says the form is required to be submitted within 14 days 15 of the transfer. Now, that requirement comes from the 16 That isn't a rule. That's nothing that I can 17 statute. 18 work with. (Laughter) 19 It says we have to get it within 14 days of the transfer into the bingo funds, and it's recently 2.0 21 come to my attention that organizations routinely send that form in later than 14 days and that the agency 2.2 hasn't really done anything about it in the past. We've 23 just kind of filed them and took them as they came. 24 But

going forward, starting next quarter -- when we're about

25

to send an e-mail blast out to everybody letting them
know -- this is going to be a violation. The statute is
very clear you have to notify us of the transfer within
4 days of the transfer. Otherwise, it's an illegal
deposit into your bingo account.

And so on the first time violation we're just going to issue a warning, but after that it will result in fines. And we're giving you guys some time because we realize that, for whatever reason, nobody has ever noticed this in the past, and it hasn't been an issue. But the law is very clear, and the form is very clear that if you're going to transfer money into your bingo account, you have to let us know within 14 days.

And so, like I said, we'll be sending out an e-mail to everybody just to reiterate that, and it will kick in next quarter.

MR. SMITH: Excellent. Well, we definitely appreciate your guidance on that and your understanding, as well. I'm assuming this is in result of the PPP loans, or --

MR. VANCE: Yeah, that's some of it, and we've also had organizations that have been borrowing money to pay for prizes and expenses. And then other situations. But it goes back apparently years that, for whatever reason, a new organization that start a new

That way --10 we're going to let the staff talk amongst themselves and 11 kind of see what, logistically, they would have to do to 12 let it be in person and let the Commissioners talk about 13 it, as well. And then, once they kind of decide and get 14 together and meet, then they'll let us know whether it's 15 going to be on the phone or in person. 16 So, their next meeting is on June the 17 18 So, that will give us a good week and a half, 19 almost -- that will give us 13 days to either meet in person or on the phone.
