## ***JACKPOT ALERT***

MORE THAN \$1.4 BILLION UP FOR GRABS THIS WEEKEND
Friday’s Mega Millions ${ }^{\circledR}$ jackpot is an estimated $\$ 560$ million $-7^{\text {th }}$ largest jackpot in game history; Saturday's Powerball ${ }^{\circledR}$ jackpot is set at an estimated $\$ 875$ million $-7^{\text {th }}$ largest in U.S. lottery history


#### Abstract

AUSTIN - The jackpots continue to soar, giving Texas Lottery ${ }^{\circledR}$ players great excitement heading into the weekend, as the Mega Millions ${ }^{\circledR}$ and Powerball ${ }^{\otimes}$ jackpots combine for more than $\$ 1.4$ billion. Tonight's Mega Millions jackpot is set at an estimated annuitized $\$ 560$ million - the seventh highest in game history, while Saturday's Powerball jackpot currently stands at an estimated annuitized $\$ 875$ million - the seventh largest jackpot prize in U.S. lottery history and third highest in Powerball history.


"The multijurisdictional jackpot games are on an exhilarating collision course, as both the Mega Millions and Powerball jackpots are now advertising jackpot prizes of more than $\$ 500$ million simultaneously for only the third time in history and the first time since January 2021," said Gary Grief, executive director of the Texas Lottery. "Sales for both of these games continue to roll in at a steady pace, which is helping us fulfill our mission of generating revenue for public education in Texas. While we are keeping our fingers crossed that at least one of these dueling jackpots will be won by a Texas Lottery player, we want to remind our players to play responsibly. It only takes one ticket to win."

Tonight's Mega Millions jackpot offers an estimated cash value of $\$ 281.1$ million. If there is no jackpot winner for tonight's drawing, the jackpot for the Tuesday, July 18 drawing will be an estimated annuitized $\$ 640$ million.

Texas has had 13 Mega Millions jackpot prize winners since it joined the game in 2003. Its most recent winner came in September 2019 when a Leander resident won an estimated annuitized $\$ 227$ million prize. The claimant chose the cash value option and received \$157,091,592 before taxes; the largest prize ever paid out to a single Texas Lottery player.

Saturday's Powerball jackpot offers an estimated cash value of $\$ 441.9$ million. If there is no jackpot winner for tomorrow night's Powerball drawing, the Grand Prize for the Monday, July 17 drawing will be an estimated annuitized $\$ 940$ million.

Since joining the game in 2010, Texas has had two Powerball jackpot winners, including its most recent in February 2015 when TL Management Trust, Andrew Weber, Trustee of Austin, claimed a share of the $\$ 564.1$ million jackpot prize with two other winners.

Since the start of 2023, 16 Texas Lottery players have won second-tier Powerball (10) and Mega Millions (6) prizes of $\$ 1$ million or larger, including six during the current jackpot runs.

Mega Millions is played by choosing five numbers from a field of 70 and one Mega Ball number from the second field of 25 numbers. To win the Mega Millions jackpot, players must match all six numbers drawn including the Mega Ball. Players matching fewer numbers may not win the jackpot, but could still walk away winners. Mega Millions currently offers a $\$ 20$ million starting jackpot and a second-tier (Match $5+0$ ) prize of $\$ 1$ million. By choosing the Megaplier ${ }^{\circledR}$ feature for $\$ 1$ more per Play, players can multiply their non-jackpot winnings by two, three, four or five times, winning as much as $\$ 5$ million. Drawings are broadcast each Tuesday and Friday at 10:12 p.m. CT. Ticket sales for the next Mega Millions drawing will close at 9:45 p.m. CT on Friday, July 14.

Powerball Grand Prizes currently start at $\$ 20$ million and roll until the jackpot is won. Players win the Grand Prize by matching five numbers from a field of 69 numbers and one Powerball number from a field of 26 numbers. By choosing Power Play ${ }^{\circledR}$ for $\$ 1$ more per Play, players can multiply their non-Grand Prize winnings by two, three, four, five or 10 times*. A Power Play Match Five (5+0) prize is set at $\$ 2,000,000$ regardless of the Power Play number selected. All other non-Grand Prizes will be multiplied by the Power Play number selected. *The 10X Power Play multiplier is available for drawings in which the initially advertised annuitized Grand Prize amount is $\$ 150$ million or less. Ticket sales for the next Powerball drawing will close at 9 p.m. CT on Saturday, July 15.

Texas Lottery players can purchase Mega Millions and Powerball tickets at more than 20,000 Texas Lottery retailers across the state. The retailer that sells a jackpot-winning Mega Millions or Powerball ticket is eligible to receive up to a $\$ 1$ million retailer bonus.

About the Texas Lottery
Beginning with the first ticket sold in 1992, the Texas Lottery has generated $\$ 37.1$ billion in revenue for the state and distributed $\$ 81.5$ billion in prizes to lottery players. Since 1997, the Texas Lottery has contributed $\$ 31.2$ billion to the Foundation School Fund, which supports public education in Texas. As authorized by the Texas Legislature, certain Texas Lottery revenues benefit state programs including the Fund for Veterans' Assistance. Since the first veterans' themed scratch ticket game was launched in 2009, the Texas Lottery has contributed more than $\$ 215$ million for programs supporting Texas veterans.
