PALESTINE RESIDENT CLAIMS \$3 MILLION SCRATCH TICKET PRIZE

AUSTIN – A Palestine resident claimed a top prize winning ticket worth \$3 million in the Texas Lottery[®] scratch ticket game <u>Maximum Millions</u>. The ticket was purchased at JJ's Fastop #107, located at 1220 E. Palestine Ave., in Palestine. The claimant elected to remain anonymous.

This was the first of four top prizes worth \$3 million to be claimed in this game. Maximum Millions offers more than \$150 million in total prizes. Overall odds of winning any prize in the game are one in 3.93, including break-even prizes.
