## Texas Lottery<sup>®</sup> Set to Launch Daily 4<sup>™</sup> On-line Game with Sum It Up<sup>™</sup> Add-on Feature in September

Starting in September, Texas Lottery<sup>®</sup> players will have yet another on-line game option to choose from; it's called *Daily*  $4^{\mathbb{M}}$  and it features twice-daily drawings, six days a week! [432904] An add-on feature of *Daily* 4, called *Sum It Up*<sup>TM</sup>, will offer players even more opportunities to win.

After conducting market research and careful planning, the new game and add-on feature were approved by the Texas Lottery Commission on May 16, 2007. Sales for *Daily* **4** and *Sum It Up* are slated to begin on September 30, with the first drawings to be held at 12:27 p.m. and 10:12 p.m. on October 1.

"We believe *Daily* 4 will be an extremely attractive new game for our players and retailers alike," said Texas Lottery Executive Director Anthony J. Sadberry. "We expect this game and the *Sum It Up* feature will nicely

Daily 4 should especially appeal to Pick 3<sup>™</sup> players, a game that has grown steadily in popularity and sales since its introduction in 1993. The biggest difference between the games, aside



from the extra number, is that *Daily* **4** offers even larger potential prize amounts and more exciting ways to play and win! In fact, qualitative research via focus groups composed of *Pick* **3** and *Cash Five*<sup>®</sup> players showed that an overwhelming majority of those players (80 percent and 63 percent, respectively) would be "very" or "somewhat" likely to play a four-digit game.

Similar in many ways to the current *Pick 3* game, *Daily 4* will offer a 50-cent minimum play, twelve drawings a week (six day and six night drawings) and a multi-draw ticket-purchase option. *Daily 4* will be played just like *Pick 3*, except that players will select four numbers between 0 and 9. They also get to choose their play type (including Pair Play) and wager amount. There are 10,000 possible combinations ranging from 0000 to 9999.

## Daily 4 with Sum It Up cont'd from cover

Another exciting aspect of Daily 4 is Sum It Up, which allows players the chance to win a prize even if they don't win the *Daily* 4 game. For an additional wager (50 cents to \$5), players can win if the sum of their numbers is the same as the sum of the winning numbers drawn in the applicable drawing. For example, if the player's numbers are 1-3-5-7 (sum = 16) and the numbers drawn are 3-4-6-3 (sum = 16), the player wins if they purchased the Sum It Up feature, even though their numbers did not match those drawn.

Along with Daily 4, Sum It Up will make its debut in September and, later this year in November, it will be available as an add-on feature to *Pick* 3 as well.

Daily 4, with or without the Sum It Up add-on feature, [311877] offers a variety of play types as illustrated in the chart below and on the opposite page.

**STRAIGHT** – A "straight" play is a winning play if the player's four single-digit numbers match in exact order the four single-digit numbers drawn. The prize for a winning 50-cent straight play would be \$2,500, and \$25,000 for a winning \$5 play.

**BOX** – A "box" play is a winning play if the player's four single-digit numbers match in any order the four single-digit numbers drawn in the applicable drawing. []34084] A box bet is similar to an "ANY" bet in Pick 3; however, in Daily 4 there are four different box play options: 4-way, 6-way, 12-way and 24-way. Prize amounts for matching combinations on box play range from \$100 for a 50-cent play on a 24-way box, to \$6,000 for a \$5 play on a 4-way box.

**STRAIGHT/BOX** – A "straight/box" play is a winning play if either the player's four single-digit numbers match in exact order the numbers drawn or if the player's four single-digit numbers match in any order the numbers drawn. The prize amount is greater if the player's four single-digit numbers match in exact order the numbers drawn. The prize amount is drawn in the applicable drawing. Prize amounts for matching combinations on straight/box play range from \$100 for a 50-cent play on a straight/24-way box (numbers matched in any order) to \$31,000 for a \$5 play on a straight/4-way box (numbers matched in exact order). [145578]

**COMBO** – A "combo" play combines all of the possible straight plays that can be played with the four single-digit numbers selected for the play. [222911] A combo play may be a 4-way combo play, a 6-way combo play, a 12-way combo play, or a 24-way combo play.

**PAIR PLAY** – A "front-pair" play is a winning play if the player's two single-digit numbers match in exact order the first two single-digit numbers drawn. A "mid-pair" play is a winning play if the player's two single-digit numbers match in exact order the second and third single-digit numbers drawn, and a "back-pair" play is a winning play if the player's two single-digit numbers match in exact order the last two singledigit numbers drawn. The prize for a winning 50-cent pair play would be \$25, and \$250 for a winning \$5 pair play.

"As a mature lottery, we've long recognized the need to continually evaluate our mix of products and, when necessary, make changes to existing games or, as in the case with *Daily* **4** and *Sum It Up*, add new games and enhancements," said Executive Director Sadberry. "This is a step in that direction, and we believe it's a good step toward helping ensure continued player interest and revenue generation for the state."

Each day, Swif-T staff will be there to explain the games and to encourage players to try the great variety of lottery games available.

Fairgoers can experience the excitement of playing our newest game, *Daily 4*, which will have an added feature called *Sum It Up*. The feature gives players an additional chance to win up to \$2,500 on a 50-cent play. Sales for *Daily 4* and *Sum It Up* are slated to begin on September 30, with the first drawings to be held at 12:27 p.m. and 10:12 p.m. on October 1. Fairgoers can also play for the multi-million dollar *Mega Millions*<sup>®</sup> and *Lotto Texas*<sup>®</sup> jackpots, or try to win big bucks in our other on-line games—*Cash Five, Texas Two Step*<sup>®</sup> and *Pick 3*. Players will also be able to win instantly on more than 50 different scratch-off games!

The Texas Lottery Fun Center will feature the alwayspopular "Texas Lottery Game Show" at 2 p.m., 4 p.m., 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. each day. ## Texas Major League Baseball® Series Scratch-off a Big Hit with Texas Lottery Players

Texas Lottery players are devoted to their state's pro baseball teams as demonstrated by the sales of the very successful *Texas Major League Baseball*<sup>®</sup> *Seriel* scratch-off ticket released on April 23rd. This game featured artwork depicting the stadiums of the Houston Astros and the Texas Rangers. Prizes in this game included a merchandise prize pack with valuable MLB merchandise, including an authentic jersey with the winner's choice of player stitched on the back, a team jacket, a windshirt, a diamond plaque, stadium seats, ball cap and a team flag. With second week sales exceeding \$4 million, it's obvious that Texans were eager to play for their chance of winning either the collector's merchandise or the top prize of \$50,000! The Texas Lottery will continue to look for branded games that will bring players interesting prize opportunities in the future.



## Mega Millions® Promotions Produce Some Mega-Winners!

The Texas Lottery conducted a *Mega Millions* promotion from March 25 through April 14, during which players who spent \$10 or more on one *Mega Millions* ticket [144375] received two FREE *Mega Millions* Quick Picks. By the promotion's end, more than 345,000 free tickets had been generated.

The biggest winner during the promotion was Eduardo Oviedo of San Antonio, who won \$250,000 on one of the two promotional *Mega Millions* Quick Picks he received.

Oviedo bought tickets for the Friday, March 30 drawing, then put them, along with the two free Quick Picks, in the console of his car and forgot about them. "I checked the ticket in Monday's *San Antonio Express-News*, and like anybody else, I couldn't believe what I was seeing," said Oviedo. One of his free Quick Picks appeared to match several numbers. "I kept reading the numbers from right to left and then left to right to make sure I was reading the numbers correctly. I was only one number away from the Mega Ball, too."

"This prize will make me debt free," Oviedo said. "I'm also going to pay off my mortgage and buy my wife the new house we've been talking about for some time. She deserves it; she is really the one who takes care of my 93-year-old mother who lives with us and has Alzheimer's disease, and the two of us also take care of my two little grand-daughters while my son and daughter-in-law are at work. That's why I might retire completely, to help my wife out more."

Oviedo also said he plans to tithe to his church, City Christian Fellowship Church. [258]63]

"Our lottery winners often use their prizes to make life easier for their families, as Mr. Oviedo is planning to do, and it is certainly worth noting that family is first," said Texas Lottery Commission Executive Director Anthony J. Sadberry.

"I got a big birthday present from the Texas Lottery with those tickets," said Oviedo said, who turned 62 the day he received the two free tickets. "Even though the prize was on the free ticket, [145484] I still say you won't win unless you buy a ticket." He purchased his tickets at the West Avenue Express (Fuel Station #3 see below), 3202 West Ave. in San Antonio.

In addition to the player promotion, retailers had the opportunity for a bonus as well. A limited-time retailer bonus promotion was conducted from March 20 thru May 4. The retailers listed below sold a winning second-tier *Mega Millions* ticket during the promotional period and became eligible for the [139979] limited-time \$2,000 retailer bonus.
