This is the Texas Lottery's first new on-line game launch since joining the multistate *Mega Millions*<sup>®</sup> game in December 2003. The first *Daily* 4 drawing was held October 1. To help kick off the new game, the Texas Lottery conducted a free ticket player promotion from October 1 through October 21. Players who spent \$4 (or more) on *Daily* 4 on one ticket received one free *Daily* 4 Quick Pick and one free play of *Sum It Up*. More than 565,000 free tickets were given away during the promotion!

"I'd like to thank everyone who made the start of *Daily 4* a success," said Texas Lottery Executive Director Anthony Sadberry. "Months of hard work by Lottery and GTECH staff—and of course our retailers—went into the creation and launch of this game.
