FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Is it against the law to sell tickets to a person under the age of 18?

A. Yes. It is a criminal offense (Class C misdemeanor) to knowingly sell or offer to sell a lottery ticket to a person younger than 18 years of age. Also, if a person younger than 18 years of age purchases a lottery ticket, they are committing a criminal offense. Some retailers check a player's ID to avoid selling tickets to minors.

Q. What do I do if I think a minor is attempting to purchase tickets at the lottery self-service vending machine?

Every retail location equipped with a lottery self-service machine is provided with a remote shut-off device to allow for the control of sales transactions. Remember, you may only conduct lottery transactions with adults.
