## WHAT ARE THE SIGNS OF A GAMBLING PROBLEM?

There is no physical test that indicates gambling behavior, but here are some signs to look for:

- ✓ Borrows money to cover gambling debts
- ✓ Gambles when feeling bored or distressed
- ✓ Lies to family and friends about gambling
- ✓ Tries to win back money lost
- ✓ Is often preoccupied with gambling
- ✓ Loses interest in other activities
- ✓ Is argumentative or defensive about gambling behavior
- ✓ Is absent for long periods of time
- ✓ Goes without basic needs in order to gamble

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Q. What should I do if I think a player has a gambling problem?

**A.** Texas Lottery games are designed for entertainment and we encourage responsible play of all lottery games. Addressing a potential gambling problem with a customer can be a challenging situation and ultimately the decision to mention a possible gambling problem is at the discretion of the retailer. The Texas Lottery provides a retailer training video, educational materials and a list of responsible gaming resources on our website. The video may assist retailers with tools for approaching a customer whose behavior is a concern. We

also supply all retail locations with PLAY RESPONSIBLY brochures which list possible signs of problem gambling and helpful resources for players.

### Q. What is problem gambling?

**A.** The National Council on Problem Gambling identifies problem gambling as behaviors that compromise, disrupt or damage personal, family or vocational pursuits. Some signs of a gambling problem include: preoccupation with gambling, a need to bet more money more frequently, restlessness when attempting to stop, and "chasing" losses.
