

100 Tickets Per Transaction TALKING POINTS

as of 10.13.2025

Due to recent <u>legislation</u> (S.B. 3070 – Sec. 466.255)

passed during the 89th Texas Legislature,

it is now a Class B misdemeanor for a person to sell

more than 100 lottery tickets to one individual in a single transaction.

REMINDERS TO TEXAS LOTTERY® RETAILERS

- No more than 100 lottery tickets may be sold <u>in a single transaction</u> to one person, whether draw game tickets, scratch tickets or any combination.
- Full packs of \$1, \$2, and \$3 games, whether opened or unopened, cannot be sold in a single transaction because these game packs contain more than 100 tickets.
- Players may continue to select multiple boards/draws for a single draw game ticket.
- The lottery transaction and payment must be completed before attempting another lottery transaction.
- Retailers may sell lottery tickets only to adults (18 or older).
- Credit cards are never accepted for Texas Lottery purchases.

EQUIPMENT CHANGES

In support of this legislation, lottery-provided vending machines and automated scratch ticket dispensers have new purchasing limitations.

- As of June 23, 2025, players may insert a maximum \$100 for purchases at any Texas Lottery vending machine (LVM: Gemini™ and GT20). Prior to this change, the LVM accepted up to \$300.
- As of August 12, 2025, retailers may sell a maximum of 100 tickets per transaction through SCiQ™ equipment.
