In accordance with the Texas Lottery Commission's (Commission) Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) Rules, Section 403.301 (Reference, 1 TAC, Sections 111.15) and relating to the Texas Government Code, Title 10, Subtitle D, Section 2161.124(a), each agency is required to prepare, as part of its strategic plan, a written plan for increasing the agency's use of HUBs in purchasing (goods and services) and in public works contracts (construction). The following plan, including but not limited to the items listed below, will be implemented by the **Commission's Business Development and Compliance Division** to increase the utilization of HUBs during Fiscal Year 2003 in the procurement categories related to the Commission's strategies and programs:

- 1. Coordinate and conduct Commission Minority/HUB Forums for all procurements over \$100,000;
- 2. Develop new mentor protégé relationships under the Commission's Mentor Protégé Program;
- 3. Implement new HUB Rule revisions that are adopted by the Texas Building and Procurement Commission (TBPC) and ensure the new requirements are communicated to Commission staff and TLC contract vendors;
- 4. Advertise minority/HUB outreach events in minority newspapers to maximize HUB inclusion in all Commission procurements;
- 5. Develop and maintain a "Forecast of Texas Lottery Contract Opportunities Manual" that identifies potential contract opportunities to be solicited during the current biennium;
- 6. Merge the TLC Minority Development Division and the Contract Management Section into one division to effectively plan the TLC's procurement process during the fiscal year;
- 7. Continue to use the TBPC's Centralized Master Bidders List (CMBL/HUB Directory) and other minority databases to recruit and identify potential HUBs for contract and subcontracting opportunities;
- 8. Supplement all contract opportunities with additional HUBs to increase HUB inclusion and opportunities for awards;
- 9. Establish a reporting mechanism for TLC lessors to report their utilization of HUB and minority-owned businesses;
- 10. Host quarterly procurement seminars for interested vendors to assist them in becoming familiar with the Commission's procurement process;
- 11. Attend statewide forums, expos, and tradeshows to provide information about the Commission and its procurement opportunities; and,
- 12. Contact current contract vendors in specific procurement categories (i.e., special trade, professional services) to determine whether they are eligible to be HUB certified and when applicable, assist all eligible vendors to become certified as HUBs.
